HOMEBOUND INSTRUCTION

Homebound instruction is a service provided to students who are unable to attend school due to medical, emotional, or disciplinary problems. Elementary students must receive a minimum of one hour of instruction per day, five days a week, when school is in session.

The School District makes provisions for homebound instruction upon referral from the Chief School Psychologist. Requests for homebound instruction must include appropriate documentation of the student's inability to attend school, i.e., doctor's note, CSE recommendation.

Upon receipt of a doctor's letter verifying that the pupil will be unable to attend school for at least two weeks, due to illness or injury, the Superintendent of Schools is authorized to immediately furnish for the student home teaching. The Board reserves the right to have the School Physician review a child's medical records and/or conduct a medical examination as deemed appropriate.

A parent or guardian must be present during homebound instruction.
