#### 4. PUBLIC COMMENT VIA EMAIL

Dr. Seniuk read the two questions :

Laura Hulsaver said that during her son's close-contact quarantine, he missed a few days of instruction and asked why the district is not allowing students to remote in to their classrooms. She complimented Mr. Monaco for his constant student support.

Dr. Seniuk explained that the district has put in place quarantine tutoring services for students who are individually quarantining when their classmates are in school. The principals also provide coverage for the classroom teacher so that they may interact with the child who is home quarantining and give any additional support that they may need. She stated that North Merrick has not moved to cameras in the classroom, and nor has any of the component elementary districts. She said the tutoring and virtual meetings between teachers and students have been implemented to help students with missed instruction.

Manuel Gomes commented on the incident that occurred at Camp Avenue School involving the crossing guard. He said the crossing guard's bravery and commitment to the safety of the students should be acknowledged.

Dr. Seniuk said she mentioned the incident in her opening statement and is very thankful for the heroism of all of the crossing guards, who sometimes put themselves at peril to protect students and parents.

Ms. Ryan added that the board was immediately made aware of the incident and that Dr. Seniuk reached out to the crossing guard and, from her understanding, the crossing guard is still out on leave. Ms. Ryan said that when the crossing guard is back, she will be honored appropriately. She said her bravery did not go unnoticed, and it was always the intent of the board and Dr. Seniuk to acknowledge that at tonight's board meeting.
