SAMPLE

TITLE: Hieroglyphics and Me

OUTCOME What will students be able to do?	Students will communicate how hieroglyphics connect history, culture, art, and symbolism. Students will decode hieroglyphics using a hieroglyphic key Students will communicate, with each other, without using their traditional ABC's. Students will create artwork that depicts their own names in their own hieroglyphic designs (i.e. if Bob likes baseball, his first image might be a baseball)
ESSENTIAL QUESTION What overarching question directs this enrichment session?	How do pictures and symbols tell stories and record history?
UNDERSTANDINGS What will students need to know to achieve the desired outcome?	Hieroglyphics connect history, culture, art, and symbolism A single picture symbol may represent a whole word (ideogram) or a sound (phonogram)
EXIT TICKET	How does my hieroglyphic design represent me?
BLURB	Learn how to be a detective! During this session, we will explore drawings and clues that will help us unravel history and will help us create our own name puzzles for our family and friends to decode!
